Since the last edition of Pioneer Press, many questions have been asked regarding the New Outlook membership trial. I believe it will be "space well spent" to clarify.


Increased membership, especially younger membership, is vital to the very survival of our New Outlook Pioneer chapters, councils and clubs.

In 2005, the Board of Directors approved a three-year trial for New Outlook Pioneers to increase local membership by recruiting outside the traditional "employees and retirees" criteria. That means every New Outlook Pioneer member can sign up their spouse, or significant other, previously called "Partners", their children, grandchildren, siblings, friends, neighbors, and anyone interested in pioneering with you at projects and /or social functions.

These new members will be full "Regular Members" and will be eligible to vote, hold office and pay dues...only \$15 per year. There is also a "Family Membership" category including parents and children under 18, for only \$25 per year.

I encourage each member to sign up one or two new members, or family, this year, and strengthen the future of this organization you believe in.

Project Connect

In the spirit of continuing with our successful Project Connect development, we have plans for the upcoming fall season when school is back in session.

To follow our venture at the Nebraska Association of Teachers of Science (NATS) conference held at Camp Calvin Crest near Fremont, we're hoping to supplement our recruiting by making another appearance on October 10th as well as presenting to the teachers in a session. Last year we signed up 31 organizations.

In addition we are scheduled to travel to Des Moines two weeks later to roll out the program to Iowa Science Teachers at their conference. To encourage participation we will be offering several Fly Fusions as prizes in our next contest.

We understand that these are very desirable among school children since what they are supposed to be able to do is take virtually anything written with the special pen and pad and save it into a computer. Our plan is to end the contest just before Christmas so the prizes can be awarded in time for the holiday season. Another distinct advantage to awarding these as prizes is that they are "mailable" so that if a winner is at a somewhat remote location we should be able to post it for a reasonable cost.

My understanding is that much of the TelcomPioneering universe is watching what we're doing with Project Connect. In fact, it is quite possible that our fellow Pioneers at Qwest may be joining us for part of the above plan.

The Pioneer triangle was designed by Henry Pope. Then in the 1940's the words Fellowship, Loyalty and Service became attached to the three sides. In 1959 the triangle was registered with the United States Patent Office as a membership mark.

Its three sides are intended to symbolize the three principal objectives of the Telephone Pioneers: **Fellowship**, **Loyalty** and **Service**. **Fellowship** comes first and is the foundation upon which loyalty and service rest. **Loyalty**, represented by the left side, marks the relationship of our members to each other, no less than to the industry they serve. **Service**, signified by the right side of the emblem, is an outgrowth of both fellowship and loyalty and has become an integral part of the Pioneer program as well as the motto of our business.
